Waited in Vain ...

A man, who did not care one bit about the Bible, wanted to convince a young Christian that the Bible was outdated and contradictory to modern discoveries. He wanted to send him a few chosen articles from science and philosophy about this topic.

The young man, however, could not be shaken in his faith. He answered: "If you've got anything **better than the Sermon on the Mount** (Matthew 5-7), anything **nicer than the stories about the Good Samaritan, the Prodigal Son, or the woman at the Well of Sychar** (Luke 10 and 15, John 4); if you have anything **more comforting than Psalm 23** or know anything that **reveals God's love towards me better than the gift of His Son Jesus Christ**, or can give me anything that **describes future eternity more clearly than the Bible**: please send it to me as quickly as possible!"

He waited in vain for a reply.

There is no book that can be compared to the Bible. The reason is simple: the Bible is God's book.

How the Bible Came to Us

How, and on what did people write?

3000 BC If anybody wanted to write a "letter" 5,000 years ago, he didn't do it with paper and ink. People used the so-called cuneiform in those days – signs and symbols that were engraved into little clay tablets, which were then dried or fired.

During excavations in old cities in today's Syria and Iraq, thousands of little clay tablets containing this writing have been found.




1500 BC At approximately the same time, the Egyptians developed a different pictographic and symbolic writing (hieroglyphics), which you can also find in the pyramids. It took linguists centuries to decipher the writings of these oldest languages of mankind.

1000 BC These forms of writing had a big disadvantage: they consisted of hundreds of symbols. It was only in 1500 BC that the alphabet was invented.

With a few changes, this alphabet spread quickly from 1000 BC. It is the basis of our Latin alphabet, which is still used today.

Apart from clay, stone or wood, people in later centuries wrote on papyrus, which is produced from the pulp of the papyrus plant. Later, people wrote on parchment (specially made animal skins), which was made into scrolls.



This is how God took care in a wonderful way that at the time when the Bible was written down, there was a simple, yet clear system of writing available.

Writing, collecting and storing

Moses was one of the first writers of the Bible. We read a couple of times that God gave him the task of writing in a book the things that had happened.

Through God's chosen people, the various books of the Old Testament were collected and stored carefully.

In approximately 400 BC the OLD TESTAMENT was finished. It was written in the Hebrew language, with a few short passages in Aramaic.

100 AD It was only from the death and the ascension of Jesus Christ until the end of the 1st Century that the books and epistles of the NEW TESTAMENT were written in the widespread Greek language of that time.

Moses died in approximately 1400 BC, so we can say that the Bible was produced over a period of 1500 years.

Completed and Concluded

Very early, the first Christians knew through the leading of the Holy Spirit which books belonged to the Bible and which did not. They had clear criteria for the acknowledgment of a book and thus could distinguish well which books were genuine (canonical), and which were not genuine (apocryphal).

Martin Luther judged **these apocryphal books**, saying that they were “not considered equal to the Holy Scripture.” In reading these texts, you will notice that they consist of extreme contradictions to the books of the Bible.

Fairy-tales about the Lord Jesus and the apostles, forged letters from biblical characters as well as historical and geographical mistakes can be found. In 1545, during the Council of Trent, these books were falsely declared “equal” to the other books of the Bible, amongst other things to support the Council’s deviant doctrines. This all shows clearly that the Apocrypha has no divine origin. That is why you should read Bible editions without the apocryphal books.

God’s Word includes a diverse range of books which were carefully selected through the leading of the Holy Spirit, and it has been completed for all time.

The Bible is rightly called the Holy Scripture, because it comes from God, not from human authority. Even today it is the highest authority for our faith and our life.

Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away.

Reliable Manuscripts

More than 5,000 manuscripts and fragments of the New Testament in the Greek language have been preserved. The most popular manuscript is Codex Sinaiticus, a still almost completely preserved Greek Bible

from the 3rd Century which was found by the scholar Constantine von Tischendorf in Saint Catherine’s Monastery on the Sinai Peninsula in 1859. This priceless biblical treasure not only contained parts of the Old Testament, but also **the complete New Testament with its 27 books.**

In addition to the diverse New Testament manuscripts and fragments, there were **approximately 9,000 old translations** from the original texts. Together with **36,000 Bible quotes** from the so-called Church Fathers, it led to an almost one hundred percent reconstruction of the original text through intensive exploration.

Not a single text variant casts doubt on the truth of God’s message in the New Testament.

The precision of the handing down of Bible texts throughout the millennia is unique.

The Caves of Qumran

During the spring of 1947, a boy from a Bedouin tribe, who was supposedly searching for a runaway goat, found the entrance to a hidden cave in the rugged hillside of Qumran on the western shore of the Dead Sea.

He threw a stone into the little mouth of the cave. To his surprise he heard the noise of breaking clay. He wondered what that could be.

With curiosity, he squeezed himself into this mysterious cave and found a number of clay jugs in which there were rolls of leather (scrolls), wrapped in canvas. These were old, extremely precious manuscripts which were still in surprisingly good condition, even after 1,900 years.

The shepherd boy took a scroll with him and found to his surprise that archaeologists were very interested in it. A wild hunt for these unique manuscripts emerged between greedy adventurers and scholars.

Prices for these scrolls rose into millions. This sensational discovery in the caves of Qumran put the scholarly world in motion.

For us, the scroll of the book of Isaiah is the most important one as it is the oldest complete copy of a book of the Bible.

There is not a single doubt about the authenticity of the manuscript, which

was written in the 2nd Century BC. When comparing it to the 1,000 year younger Masoretic text (Hebrew text of the Hebrew Bible) of the book of Isaiah, the scholars discovered with surprise that there was basically no difference! The texts coincided with one another with astonishing precision!

Because the text of this scroll was uninterrupted, all the Bible critics who had claimed that the book of Isaiah had been compiled over the centuries and was incorrect were disproved.

Among the vast findings of Qumran were around 250 scrolls of Old Testament Bible texts which proved that the manuscript copies were handed down with exceptional accuracy.

God watched over His Word so that we may hold it in our hands unaltered. God's Word is like a rock: it is immovable.

But the word of the Lord endures forever.

Bible Production

<< Past and Present >>



Over 500 years ago the development of printing changed the world. Before this, if someone wanted a Bible it had to be copied by hand, which was very time-consuming and thus cost a fortune.

In order to preserve the original text, it was necessary to know the oldest manuscripts because copying from one to another brought with it the danger of alterations.



Discoveries of texts prove astonishing things: the 3,000+ familiar old manuscripts of the Hebrew Bible coincide remarkably with one another, and confirm the familiar text. The oldest parts of the Bible, which came into being almost 3,500 years

ago, have been handed down precisely into our time.

How was that possible? In reverence to the Holy Word of God, the Jews observed a large number of rules to ensure accurate copying. For example, single letters or the occurrence of certain words were counted and checked repeatedly.

Today, vast numbers of editions of Bibles can be produced economically and in minimal time through the latest printing shops.

Meanwhile, many digital online Bibles and Bible apps are available for free.

The Bible and Science

How can a book that was written such a long time ago with its statements on nature and history always be right? Why is it not scientifically possible to disprove the Bible?

There are numerous examples where modern science has taken a long time to catch up with the statements of the Bible. Here are two of them:

Is the earth spherical?

God never claimed that the earth was a disc and that the sun revolved around the earth. This is what many scientists consistently believed for a very long time.



On the contrary, God says in one of the oldest books of the Bible, in Job 26:7: **“He stretches out the north over empty space; He hangs the earth on nothing.”**

Is the hare a ruminant?

In Leviticus 11:4&6 it says: **“Nevertheless these you shall not eat among those that chew the cud ... the hare, because it chews the cud...”**

This statement of the hare being a ruminant was held as false for many centuries.

However, in the 19th century scientists found out that the hare has two different kinds of excretions. One of them is eaten up again to absorb vital nutrients.



Thus science is still forced to agree with the Bible over and over again after years of research. Also, biblical statements are not contradictory to current scientifically and archaeologically proven facts.



Could It Be Any Different?

Should God, who created the universe and gave us His Word (the Bible), contradict Himself? No, both these revelations of God, CREATION and the WORD, mutually confirm each other.

The Message of the Bible

> God created you

So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

The Bible – Genesis 1:27

You are God's creature. There is only one of you in this world. In addition to this, your body and all of its functions – brain, systems, organs – have been brilliantly created by God. There is no hint of time and chance – as the unproven theory of evolution claims. God has created man "in His image", i.e. to represent Him in this creation.

However, man fell into sin and turned away from God.

> God classifies you as a "sinner", too

For there is no difference; for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. The Bible – Romans 3:22&23

To sin means to act without submission to God. It makes no difference whether sin is visible as a deed, or if it is said out loud, or maybe just practised in the thoughts. The Lord Jesus once said that hatred towards a man is as bad a sin as killing!

> God will be your judge

And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment... The Bible – Hebrews 9:27

God is absolutely holy and righteous. That is why He must one day judge everything that is not consistent with His nature. The Bible makes unmistakably clear that every man who dies without forgiveness of sins will have to expect eternal separation from God. Unlike heaven, where everybody who has a relationship with the Lord Jesus will be, there will be a place that the Bible calls "hell" or "the lake of fire". God will not be there, and then there will be no possibility to communicate with Him.

Yet there is hope!

> God has a great interest in you

In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him. The Bible – 1 John 4:9

Look up to the cross of Calvary where Jesus Christ experienced punishment from God by suffering terrible agonies. He was forsaken by God at the cross because He bore our sins. We cannot imagine what this must have meant for the Lord Jesus, who was completely without sin.

Do you see how much God loves you?

God's Help + Means of Salvation

We are separated from God through sin. God cannot accept our efforts to improve ourselves. God, in His holiness and purity, has to judge evil. There is only one way out: we have to accept the means of salvation which comes from God Himself.

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

The Bible – John 3:16

In order to reveal God, your Creator, Jesus Christ became man and came down to earth to us.

Jesus Christ has shown us God's love. He proved it fully by dying for you at the cross of Calvary. As your representative, He took upon Himself the punishment for your sins – if you believe in Him.

If you accept this in faith and confess your sins to God, He will give you forgiveness and eternal life.

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

The Bible – 1 John 1:9

Jesus Christ lives! He rose from the dead and returned back into heaven.

This good news has been preached for almost 2,000 years. Salvation can thus be offered to all men. Everybody who believes in Jesus Christ – the one and only Saviour – will be freed from God's eternal judgment. Every person who accepts the work of redemption of Jesus Christ in faith will be declared righteous before God.

... being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.

Divine Promises

To sum it up, the divine letter, the Bible, says:

1. God is holy.

> *He has to judge and punish sin!*

2. God is love.

> *He wants to forgive you all of your sins.*

God can forgive you your sins because His Son, Jesus Christ, has taken upon Himself the punishment for sin and satisfied everything required by a holy God.

However, to obtain forgiveness personally you have to come before God in genuine confession of your sins, and believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross, even for you, as Saviour and Redeemer.

Then God has more than 1,000 irreversible, divine statements ready for you in His Word, the Bible.

He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him.

The Bible – John 3:36

But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name.

A Story from the Bible

A certain man had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the portion of goods that falls to me." So he divided to them his livelihood. But when he had spent all, there arose a severe famine in that land, and he began to be in want. one gave him anything. But when he came to himself, he said, "How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you, and I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired servants.'" And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him. And the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and am no longer

worthy to be called your son." But the father said to his servants, "Bring out the best robe and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his feet. And bring the fatted calf here and kill it, and let us eat and be merry; for this my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found." And they began to be merry. Now his older son was in the field. And as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. So he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. And he said to him, "Your brother has come, and because he has received him safe and sound, your father has killed the fatted calf." But he was angry and

would not go in. Therefore his father came out and pleaded with him. So he answered and said to his father, "Lo, these many years I have been serving you; I never transgressed your commandment at any time; and yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might make merry with my friends. But as soon as this son of yours came, who has devoured your livelihood with harlots, you killed the fatted calf for him." And he said to him, "Son, you are always with me, and all that I have is yours. It was right that we should make merry and be glad, for your brother was dead and is alive again, and was lost and is found."

Many Religions - All the Same God?

It is a commonly held idea in the world that all religions lead to the same God, just through different ways.

This is completely contradictory to the core message of the Bible out of the mouth of Jesus Christ: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). This truth is generally denied these days.

For example, this comparison of the Quran and the Bible clearly shows that "Allah from Islam" cannot be the God of the Bible:

QURAN ...therefore believe in Allah and his messengers, and do not say: "Three"... Allah is only one God. Far exalted is He above having a son.
The Quran - taken from Surah 4

BIBLE For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

The Bible - John 3:16

QURAN And for their saying, "Indeed, we have killed the Messiah, Jesus, the son of Mary, the messenger of Allah." And they did not kill him, nor did they crucify him; but another was made to resemble him to them.
The Quran - taken from Surah 4

BIBLE For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God ... but we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness. The Bible - 1 Corinthians 1:18&23

The Quran clearly denies that "Allah" has a son, God's trinity and the fact that Jesus Christ died on the cross! But the God of the Bible is a living God. Out of love towards you and me, He gave His Son as a sacrifice for sins - in that Christ suffered God's judgment and entered into death. Thus "Allah" cannot possibly be the biblical God, that is the Father of the Lord Jesus Christ.

By the way: biblical Christianity is not a religion!

In various religions of this world, man tries to find a way to God through his own efforts.

But the Bible shows us a holy God who came down to us in His Son Jesus Christ, so that everybody who believes in Him and confesses their sins to Him shall be saved.

But to him who does not work but believes on Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted for righteousness. The Bible - Romans 4:5

Look into the Future

The Bible gives us reliable statements concerning the future.

We are surrounded by anxiety and sorrows these days: death, immorality, violence, famine, wars, natural disasters, financial crises, tragedies, terrorism...!

However, Jesus Christ will come back soon! God clearly tells us in the Bible that the days shortly before His coming are characterised by such events. A reader of the Bible also knows how things will continue:

God will judge the world, which has turned away from Him and is now sinking in sin. Yet God **“now commands all men everywhere to repent, because He has appointed a day on which He will judge the world...”**

(Acts 17:30&31).

This will happen through His Son Jesus Christ, who will soon come back from heaven for judgment. He, the despised and crucified one, will come back as victor and with the authority of the highest judge: He is the one **“who was ordained by God to be Judge of the living and the dead”** (Acts 10:42).

Judgment is certain – but there is hope for you!



The Bible prophesied in detail of the birth of Jesus Christ as well as his death and resurrection many centuries earlier. As Jesus Christ gave His life for you, God offers you His grace and His forgiveness even today.

Come today, says God – it might be too late tomorrow:

Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation. The Bible – 2 Corinthians 6:2

Accept God's offer, then you will receive eternal salvation from this divine judgment. To do this, you must come to Him in confession of your sins.

The almighty God prophesies absolutely truthfully: no man can do that. Hundreds of prophecies in the Bible have been verifiably fulfilled. The Bible prophesied about: the empires many centuries before; the birth of Jesus Christ; the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD; the dispersal of the Jews across the whole world etc.

All this proves in a unique manner that the Bible is the Word of God.



It is easy to accuse the Bible of inaccuracy, but it is a completely different thing to actually prove this.

Translation from the Original Text

Bible translation is difficult work.

Both the Hebrew text of the Old Testament and the Greek text of the New Testament have only capital letters, which all sit very closely together without full stops or commas. That is why it is a hard task for linguists to recognise where a new sentence begins.

In addition, there are no vowels in Hebrew, like a, e, i, o, u, but only consonants (b, k, t etc.).

You have to add the vowels yourself. Genesis 1:1 for us would look like this then:

NTHBGNNGGDCRTDTHHVNSNDTHRTH

Would you be able to recognise the following sentence from this: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth"? We can therefore be very grateful for the scholars who searched for these old manuscripts, found them and translated them.



King James also made an important contribution approximately 400 years ago when he had the Bible translated into English. Ever since, many linguists have continued this work in order to translate the Bible more accurately, and to ensure that it is still comprehensible.



In the English language there are numerous Bible translations. They particularly differ as to the question of how accurately the original text is represented. Unfortunately, some modern Bible translations deviate so much from the original text that some words may lose their seriousness, for instance if "sin" is translated "mistake".

If you want to make sure that you actually read what God has written down in the Bible, we advise you to get a Bible translation that is close to the original text.

Presently, the Bible or parts of the Bible are available in more than 2,900 languages. Roughly 97% of the world's population has the possibility of reading parts of God's Word.

Yet there are still translators who sacrificially translate the Bible into more languages in the most remote areas of the earth. Often, this is very hard as they first have to create a written language.

The Bible has become the best known and the most widespread book of world literature. The number of translations (sometimes partial) into other languages has grown rapidly over the past two hundred years.

- By the year 1800, translations into 75 languages had been produced.
- By the year 1900, there were 567 translations.
- By the year 1953, there were 1167.
- By the year 1978, this number had grown to 1600.
- By the year 2017, the Bible (or parts of it) had been translated into almost 3,000 languages!

The smallest printed Bible known to us is just a bit bigger than a £2 coin. This Bible is 2.8cm long, 3.4cm wide and 1cm thick and has 1514 pages. You can read everything very well with a magnifying glass.



The smallest Old Testament ever > on a digital microchip

In 2008, Israeli scientists from the Institute of Technology in Haifa managed to write down the Old Testament on half a square millimetre. More than 300,000 words of the Old Testament in the Hebrew language were saved on a silicon chip the size of a sugar grain. It was only with the help of nanotechnology that such a mini-data carrier could be built. To read the text, the data would have to be converted and then enlarged 10,000 times.

Can it go even smaller?

> DNA - the storage medium of the future

God, the creator, has planted a brilliant storage medium into each of our body cells. Its storage capacity surpasses by far everything that is known to us as yet: it is the DNA string that has a diameter of two millionth millimetres. Inside it there is countless information about the genetic material of every human.

If we possessed prepared DNA material the size of a sugar grain with its corresponding writing and reading skills, we could "store" almost one billion complete Bibles on it. Scientists believe that gigantic DNA storages will be available in a few years.

The Bible says that we should "stop" our ears and "shut our eyes" so that we do not hear or see evil (Isaiah 33:15). Therefore a good piece of advice is:




>>> Don't eat any belladonna plants!


She quickly took her Bible and wrapped it up into a big lump of dough, which she pushed into the oven and the other loaves right behind it.







Tips for Reading the Bible

Read the Bible to get into direct contact with God. You can start, for example, with the Gospel of Luke in the New Testament, an account of the life of Jesus Christ. Furthermore, the New Testament is the key to understanding the Old Testament.



If you want to read the Bible with joy and profit, the following seven points are helpful:

1. Use a good translation

- > Use a Bible that is understandable, but that is ideally a close translation of the original text.
(Unfortunately, there are editions of the Bible in which one can find deviations from the real biblical message.)

2. Take time

- > Resolve to really leave a good quarter of an hour free every day for a “quiet time” to meet with God.
A day has 96 quarter-hours: give one of those to God. He wants to speak to you.

3. You need silence

- > Read the Bible in a quiet place
Indeed, you can read the Bible online, or download it in a free app. But by reading the Bible in a book form, you will be less distracted and you will be able to concentrate better.

4. Pray to God

- > Ask God to help you to understand what you have read.
No one can explain the Bible better than He who wrote it.
- > Ask God: “What do you want to say to me? How can I put it into practice?”
He alone sees into your heart and also knows your hardships and circumstances.
- > Thank God for His precious Word.
Reading the Bible brings blessing and great profit. See Psalm 119:162

5. Contemplate it

- > Think about what you have read.
It is of little use if you only read the Bible hastily. See Psalm 119:15&27&48
- > Underline the important texts and note parallel passages.
You will then be able to find them more easily later and remember them better.

6. Learn it by heart

- > Learn by heart verses that have become important to you.
You can recall them to your memory anytime. Therefore they will be a help to you in various situations in life. See Psalm 119:11, Colossians 3:16

Put it into practice

- > Do what God shows you and says to you in the Bible.
Obeying God makes you happy and deepens your relationship with Him. See James 1:22

Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it. The Bible – Luke 11:28

You have received numerous suggestions and a lot of information about the Bible, the "letter" from God to you. Please give God an answer now. Do not push the decision away! You should now realise how important it is to listen to God. Perhaps you will not receive another opportunity.

God wants to come to you in kindness and grace and not as a judge. He calls you to turn to Him. But if you carry on with indifference and refuse the message of God, then your path is leading to eternal separation from God, which is hell.

But God makes a wonderful offer to you through His Son, Jesus Christ:

In prayer to God, you can be relieved of all your sins with simple and honest words. He happily forgives you when you make them known to Him. Tell Him that you have lived without Him and have sinned against Him. If you do this genuinely, you can surely believe that Jesus Christ also paid the penalty for your sins when he went into death on the cross.

If you accept this great offer in faith, the way to heaven will open for you, the place of eternal, happy fellowship with God. Then your life will have a purpose and a goal.


